RE: APPROVAL FOR COMMINGLED PRODUCTION

Pex et al Jedney b-073-C/94-G-8; WA 00868; Baldonnel/Upper Charlie Lake "A" and Halfway "A"

The Commission has reviewed your application dated February 8, 1999, requesting permission to commingle gas production from the Jedney field Baldonnel/Charlie Lake and Halfway gas pools encountered in the subject well.

Reservoir pressure and fluid compositions are similar for these two pools. Jedney is a mature field where liquids associated with gas production cause wells to load-up, which can be prevented with commingled production. Accordingly, commingling will improve the economics and well production rates.

As Petro-Canada is the licensee of all wells in the immediate area completed in and producing from the Baldonnel/Charlie Lake and Halfway gas pools, as currently mapped, equity issues are not seen as being a concern.

We wish to advise you that your application to commingle production is hereby approved, under the authority of section 41 of the Drilling and Production Regulation, subject to the following conditions:

- 1. Production from the Baldonnel/Charlie Lake and the Halfway gas pools may be commingled.
- 2. Gas, condensate and water production should be allocated on the Ministry of Energy and Mines BC S-1 and BC S-2 forms on the basis of Baldonnel/Upper Charlie Lake "A" 78 % and Halfway "A" 22 %, as proposed in your application.
- 3. This approval may be modified at a later date if deemed appropriate through a change in circumstances.
